Since July 2023

WIDCCC has had over 664 client visits and has served almost 400 individual adults in our region through crisis.



The new youth crisis center

opened on January 29th after over a year of preparation by Southwest District Health, Pathways of Idaho, and our wonderful partners.



98% of clients

would visit WIDCCC again, if needed, were happy with the quality of service, and felt their cultural needs were valued.



In its first three months

WIYSC has had 55 client visits and has served 26 individual youth ages 11-17 from Canyon, Payette, and Ada County.



184 adults were diverted

from hospitals, jail, law enforcement interaction, and in-patient care. 18 deaths by suicide or overdose were prevented since July 2023.
