**A RESOLUTION OF THE CANYON COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY
COMMISSIONERS DESIGNATING SURPLUS PERSONAL PROPERTY WITH
NOMINAL VALUE AND AUTHORIZING THE DONATION OF
CANYON COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE EQUIPMENT**

The following resolution and order was considered and adopted by the Canyon County, Idaho Board of Commissioners ("Board") on this 22nd day of January, 2026.

Upon the motion of Commissioner Van Beek and the second by Commissioner Holton, the Board resolves as follows:

WHEREAS, Idaho Code § 31-801 grants general powers and duties to the Board, subject to the restrictions of law; and

WHEREAS, Idaho Code § 31-807 authorizes the Board to manage county property subject to restrictions including, but not limited to, those described in Idaho Code § 31-808; and

WHEREAS, the Canyon County Sheriff's Office ("CCSO") has determined that it is no longer in need of certain equipment and that the equipment is suitable as a donation to another agency for use; and

WHEREAS, the CCSO has determined such personal property has a value of less than \$250, has taken it out of service, and it is now surplus property;

WHEREAS, the CCSO desires to donate certain personal property to Wilder Police Department as requested and described in Attachment 1:


WHEREAS, the Canyon County Prosecuting Attorney's Office has reviewed this resolution and rendered advice to the Board and CCSO;

NOW THEREFORE, the Board hereby resolves and concludes that the equipment as described is surplus property with nominal value and is no longer of use to CCSO and is suitable for donation.

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, that CCSO is authorized to donate the certain personal property described in Attachment 1 to Wilder Police Department. Such donation shall be under the direction and supervision of the Canyon County Sheriff.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE BOARD, that this resolution shall be effective January 22, 2026.

RE: Request for Resolution to Authorize Transfer of Motorola APX6500 Mobile Radio to Wilder Police Department

Dear Members of the Canyon County Board of Commissioners,

I am writing to respectfully request consideration of a resolution authorizing the allocation of one Motorola APX6500 mobile radio serial number 527CWV1290 to the Wilder Police Department to maintain and strengthen interoperability among public safety agencies within Canyon County.

Interoperable communications are essential to effective law enforcement operations, particularly during mutual aid responses, multi-agency incidents, and countywide emergencies. The Motorola APX6500 mobile radio is fully compatible with Canyon County's 700/800 MHz radio system and supports the shared talk groups used by law enforcement agencies throughout the county. Providing this radio to the Wilder Police Department will ensure they can continue to communicate seamlessly with the Canyon County Sheriff's Office, dispatch, and other public safety partners.

The requested radio will enhance officer safety, improve situational awareness, and support coordinated response efforts during critical incidents. Maintaining consistent radio equipment standards across agencies reduces communication gaps and aligns with best practices for public safety communications and regional interoperability planning.
